It's the way the **author** chooses to tell the story.




It's the voice and scope of the **narrator**.

It **affects** how much we, as readers, know about the characters and events in the story.

Key Words:

I, We, Mine, My

*The narrator is a character in the story and tells the story using the pronoun, I.

*The narrator participates in the actions of the story

Our thoughts:

★ You only have access to the narrator's limited knowledge and understanding of the events and other characters.



CAUTION

★ The narrator can only tell us what they are thinking, feeling, or observing.

★ You have to judge if the narrator is reliable or not.

2nd Person

Key Words:

You, Your

*The story is told from the viewpoint of the **reader** using the pronoun, **YOU**

***The reader** gets to imagine being the main character!

*Example: Choose your own adventure books.

3rd Person

Key Words:

He, She, It,
They, or a Name

*A person **NOT** involved in
the story is telling the
story.

There are three types:
Objective, Limited, and
Omniscient.

3 Types

3rd Person Narration



1. Objective:

the narrator knows or reveals nothing about the characters' internal thoughts, feelings, and motivations but sticks to the external facts of the story

3 Types

3rd Person Narration



2. Limited:

The narrator describes the internal thoughts, feelings, and motivations of one character, usually the main character

We, as readers, are limited in our knowledge of other characters.

3 Types

3rd Person Narration

3. Omniscient:

The narrator knows and at least partially reveals the internal thoughts, feelings, and motivations of all the characters

Narrator peers inside the minds and hearts of characters at will and tell us what they are thinking or feeling.

Narrator interprets and comments on behavior and actions.
